Smoke Alarms

New Zealand firefighters and investigators have had to deal with two fatalities already this year, one in Orewa, north of Auckland, on 5 January and the other near Marton on 8 January. Both cases fit into a pattern that has become increasingly apparent over the past 12 months or so – older people living alone and without the protection of working smoke alarms. There's urgent work to be done here for all of us in focusing on this vulnerable section of our communities.





Otago Peninsula Community Board Update

On March 8th the Local Government Commission's hearing will take place in Dunedin on the future of community boards in Dunedin. Shortly afterwards we will learn of the decision on our Board's future re boundaries and the number of members, with any changes coming into effect later this year. We will keep you posted on these important decisions.

Roadworks

Thanks for your patience over the delays associated with the **recent resealing along Portobello Rd.** While it is a busy time of year on our Peninsula roads, the work had to be done now as higher temperatures were needed to carry out this work. The result is significant safety improvements to large stretches of Portobello Road.

A reminder that there is still no through access to and from Portobello/Dunedin via Highcliff Road. **Highcliff Road remains closed between Camp and Seal Point Roads.** The planning for the repair to this slip and another three in the area, is well underway, but the repair is complex and extremely challenging. It is expected that construction will start *no later* than April, and finished by September. We recognise the huge inconvenience and challenges the continued closure of this road poses for many people in the community and the repair remains a top priority for the Board and Council.

Portobello Rd /Harington Pt Rd Safety Improvement Project – several sections of the project are completed on Harington Pt Rd. Now there will be pause for six months until the next phase of the project begins. A great deal of work has been going on behind the scenes in preparation for the much anticipated completion of this project. Work is expected to begin in July and we will keep you updated on developments.

Grants



From the Otago Witness 22 October 1881

A most disastrous fire swept across the centre of the Peninsula on the afternoon of 14th. The Harbour Cone Cheese factory was burnt to the ground, Mr Allan's Blacksmith Shop was destroyed along with log fences blazing in every direction, while stumps, piles of firewood and trees lying about in paddocks were also burnt. A good few byres, stables and several cottages were also burnt to the ground. Settlers also lost pig sties, hen houses, out houses and several homes were partly burnt but saved by the most strenuous of efforts. Thousands of pounds worth of property has been destroyed, and of this very little is covered by insurance. When the wind went down, shortly before sunset, the danger was over, and by the time darkness set in the settlers could gaze calmly though sorrowfully on a majestic scene of destruction with fires still smouldering away.



A REMINDER ABOUT SOME PEST PLANTS WE DON'T WANT HERE

Sometimes people may think it is the job of councils to deal with pest plants of various sorts but it is very easy to deal to some of them ourselves, especially some of the common plant pests such as banana passionfruit and blackberry. Here are two more to look out for and both are likely to be in flower at the moment.

Bomarea

Pretty orange/yellow clusters at the end of a vine. If left uncontrolled bomarea can smother and eventually destroy favourite plants in your garden. Bomarea invades remnant forest and shrubland interiors. The vines grow into the tree canopy and form large masses, which overtop and smother the supporting trees. Seedlings can establish in the shade of forest interior, creeping along the ground, strangling saplings and smothering low growing species. Extensive infestations in the tree canopy alter light levels, which can kill mature trees and prevent the establishment of native species. Check the ORC website on how best to deal with this pest-plant.





Ragwort

Cluster of yellow daisy-like flowers on a tall stem. Generally found in pasture paddocks or along road verges or walking tracks. Easily pulled out by the roots when the soil is damp. Pulling out any plants prior to the seeds forming can prevent further infestation of an area. Check the tracks you walk, the road verges or your home paddock for this plant and pull it out if you can. It is a prolific seeder and the seeds may remain viable for over 10 years, and individual plants can produce from 30,000 to 150,000 seeds. One plant can become hundreds of plants over a couple of seasons. Although a poisonous weed to horses and cattle, animals likely to be affected by the toxins simply refuse to eat it, so animal deaths from eating ragwort are not common.

Rural Skip Day VEGETATION & GENERAL WASTE COLLECTION Sunday, 28 February 2016

Following on from the newly introduced 'strictly vegetation only' collection last October at the Rural Skip Day, the same collection will be available again at the next Rural Skip Day planned for Sunday, 28 February.

A discounted 'vegetation only' disposal fee will be available, once again, to Portobello and its surrounding Peninsula residents.

Mixed loads will be charged at the usual general waste fee for landfill disposal.

The 'strictly vegetation only' collection comes with some garden waste exclusions as the vegetation is taken to the Green Island Landfill site where it goes through a lengthy process, which turns the material into compost for further use.

Please do not include lawn clippings and flax or cabbage leaves as they are not suitable for composting. Any evidence of these materials will result in a general waste fee being applied for land-fill disposal.

We appreciate your co-operation in checking for any excluded materials in your 'vegetation only' load before you arrive at the Rural Skip Day site.

We hope you enjoy the Hawk n Hurl event and take advantage of saving yourself landfill fees.

Great community fundraising opportunities exist by providing good items for sale to the donate stall or a scrap metal contribution or perhaps taking part in the car boot event selling your items for re-use.
